The Season of the Church

During the month of May the seasons of our Church year will transition from Easter to Pentecost. While most of the seasons of the church year are focused on the life and ministry of Jesus, Pentecost is focused on the ministry of the Church. This is not in the absence of Jesus, but in the sense of the Church being the body of Christ continuing the ministry of Jesus following his resurrection and ascension.
